Governor Heineman Signs Credit Union Day Proclamation

Lincoln – On October 6th, Nebraska credit union members joined Governor Dave Heineman in the Warner Senate Chamber in Nebraska's State Capitol, where he signed a proclamation designating Thursday, October 21, 2010 as International Credit Union Day in the State of Nebraska.

In his proclamation, Governor Heineman wrote, "Credit unions empower people to improve their economic situations in 96 nations around the world, through 49,000 credit unions currently serving the financial needs to 177 million members, including Nebraska's 420,000 members".
